Isaiah 6:1-8 Isaiah's Commission

¹ In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord, high and exalted, seated on a throne; and the train of his robe filled the temple.² Above him were seraphim, each with six wings: With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they were flying. ³ And they were calling to one another: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory." ⁴ At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook and the temple was filled with smoke. ⁵ "Woe to me!" I cried. "I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the LORD Almighty." ⁶ Then one of the seraphim flew to me with a live coal in his hand, which he had taken with tongs from the altar. ⁷ With it he touched my mouth and said, "See, this has touched your lips; your guilt is taken away and your sin atoned for."⁸ Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? And who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I. Send me!"

The Call Process. Church Council met Tuesday evening, February 4th, with Assistant to the Bishop Deacon Sherry Krieger and Call Process Facilitator Pastor Deb Monnin of our NW Ohio Synod. Deacon Sherry and Pastor Deb reviewed the multiple phases of the upcoming call process for St. Mark's.

<u>Phase 1: The Ending Well Phase.</u> Council establishes a Farewell Committee to assist the congregation with the upcoming transition period of pastor's retirement and the arrival of transitional/interim pastoral leadership.

Phase 2: The Discovery and Transition Phase. Council establishes a Transition Committee to work through Five Focus Points with the congregation: heritage, leadership, mission, connections, and future. These Five Focus Points help discern God's mission for St. Mark's and the qualities of the pastor best suited to accomplish that mission. This process will produce the information needed for our congregation's Ministry Site Profile (MSP), i.e. our church's resume. This phase is to be completed by the end of summer.

Phase 3: The Search and Call Phase. Council establishes a Call Committee to complete the congregation's Ministry Site Profile (MSP) with the information gathered from the Transition Committee. Our MSP is then sent to our NW Ohio Synod and made available to the other sixty-four synods of our national church, the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The Call Committee is then responsible for interviewing pastoral candidates and making a recommendation to Church Council. If approved, Council then makes a recommendation to the congregation.

<u>Phase 4: The Starting Strong Phase.</u> Council establishes a Starting Strong Committee to welcome our new pastor (and possibly family) acclimate to one's new home in St. Mark's, Van Wert, Van Wert County, our local synod conference, and the NW Ohio Synod for the first twelve to eighteen months.

Luke 5:1-11 Jesus Calls His First Disciples

¹ One day as Jesus was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret, the people were crowding around him and listening to the word of God.² He saw at the water's edge two boats, left there by the fishermen, who were washing their nets. ³ He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little from shore. Then he sat down and taught the people from the boat. ⁴ When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch." ⁵ Simon answered, "Master, we've worked hard all night and haven't caught anything.
